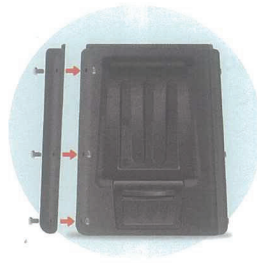
## HOW TO SET UP

# YOUR COMPOST BIN



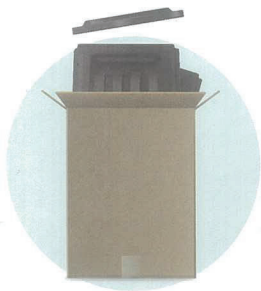

To start with, find a bare area of earth (grass is fine) with good drainage to install your compost bin. This should be conveniently located so that you can access it easily.

Repeat for all panels until you have constructed a freestanding 4-sided compost bin. Tighten the screws with a small spanner, shifter or pliers to ensure a stronger join, however if you do not have tools, hand tightened will work fine.



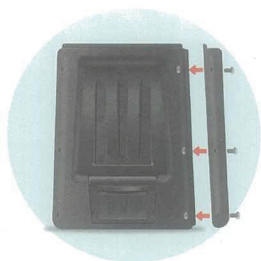

Take all the parts out of the box. All panels are the same, so any panel can serve as the front, side, or back of your compost bin once set up. Ensure the lower hatch is slotted into place on each panel.

Place the lid on top of the bin. It should slot into place over the tops of the panels. If the lid is slightly bent (which can happen due to its 100% recycled content), it will straighten out over time once it is fit onto the bin.

Hold two panels at a 90 degree angle to one another and align the 3 holes on each edge of the panel. Then thread one bolt at a time through the aligned holes, with the bolt head on the outside of the bin, and tightly screw in the nut by hand.

That's it! Remember to aerate regularly and follow the advice from our online tutorials for best results. Lift the lid or the lower hatch, whichever is easier for you, when it is time to harvest your compost.

# Stickers

We rely on you to help spread the revolution, so sticker loud and proud!



Slap your big 'No food in here' sticker your council rubbish bin (*really important to inspire your neighbours*).



Place the matching 'What goes in it?' sticker on your kitchen caddy.
